Her children's and youth books are known and loved worldwide. Her work has received many international awards, including the Anderson Award and the Astrid Lindgren Prize. Christine Nöstlinger died in Vienna in 2018.



Jens Rasmus was born in Kiel in 1967 and studied illustration in Hamburg and Scotland. He illustrates and writes books, for which he has received many awards. His pictures are of a special magic, full of secrets and surprises. He lives in Kiel with his family.
