Rangers have to **watch out** for people who are hunting out of season or fishing without a **license**. There are always people who don’t care about the environment and who have no **respect** for wildlife,” uncle Robert explained.

“I didn’t know how much animals **depend on** us for their survival. I think I would like to join an **organisation** that helps to protect endangered animals,” Paul said.
